## Growth Mindset work at WRS!

If you've visited our school recently, you may have noticed a bulletin board as you enter the building that looks like a superhero busted through with the "Power of Yet". One of our teachers, Mrs. Derosier prepared this display to help our entire school community know that we as a school staff have focused our attention on the work of Professor Carol S. Dweck of Stanford University. Ms. Dweck has done extensive research on the amazing brain's ability to learn and develop for all of us. She's done extensive research on the psychology of this and she's written a powerful book that I highly recommend: *Mindset: The New Psychology of Success*. During monthly assemblies with our students in grades k-5 I've introduced the work of Dr. Dweck by teaching our students that our brains have neurons and that when we are learning new things if we persist and practice, these neural pathways (brain pathways) become stronger and with enough **effort, persistence and practice** we solidly learn the skill. This is true when we learn to walk, talk, track with our eyes or learn how to divide and multiply fractions! As a staff we have begun the work of not only teaching this to our students, but also trying to focus our praise on **effort, process and strategy**. We are focused on helping our students learn that mistakes are expected and that when we make them it means that we haven't learned the skill **yet!** However, when we think deeply about the mistake made and ask ourselves, "What part did I do correctly, or well?" and "Which part didn't I do well or understand?" Then we **take responsibility** for figuring out our mistakes and then...we learn!
